


SN901 Base Station Installation.

- Ensure that the base station antenna is firmly connected (anti-clockwise thread)
- 2. Plug the appropriate AC/DC adaptor into a standard AC power outlet, and the other end into the "DC In" jack on the rear of the base station.
- 3. Plug phone cord into the "LINE" Jack.
- 4. A standard telephone or answering machine can be plugged into the adjacent receptacle on the rear of the base station marked TEL.



SN902 Handset and Charger Installation.

- 1. Plug the appropriate AC/DC adaptor into a standard AC power outlet, and the other end into the "DC In" jack on the rear of the Charger.
- 2. Install battery pack in the handset.
- 3. Check that the antenna is fitted.
- 4. Place handset onto the charger front slot.
- 5. Charge the battery for three hours before use.
- 6. After charging, the phone system is now ready for use.



Handset Registration

- 1. Press MENU- 6 to enter the registration mode
- 2. Press and hold the base's PAGE button for 3 seconds until the In Use LED (white color) lights up and is flashing. The base station will beep to confirm that it is in the registration mode.
- 3. Press handset key "1", this completes the registration process. The base station will assign a handset ID between 11 and 19 automatically. The assigned ID will be displayed on the handset LCD, indicating successful registration.

Handset features

- 1. TALK/FLASH
 - a. Used to make or receive a call.
 - b. Sends a Flash signal to the pstn phone line to access the call waiting feature provided by your local phone company.
 - c. If connected to a PBX, and during a call, pressing this button momentarily will put the caller on hold. Pressing again will take the caller off hold.
- 2. SPEAKERPHONE (TALK)

 Press and hold the key for 2-3 seconds to enable/disable the speakerphone during incoming, outgoing or intercom call.
- 3. 2-WAY INTERCOM (2-WAY INTERCOM)

- a. Initiates an intercom call to another handset, or a group handset (group paging) to all registered handsets.
- b. Intercom calls are digital, secure duplex (2-way), and are transmitted without connection to the base station.
- 4. BROADCAST (BROADCAST)
 - a. Half duplex (1-way) broadcasting to handsets for immediate announcement
 - b. Half duplex (1-way) broadcasting to base stations

Re: Press the ROADCAST key (in the middle of handset) to activate the broadcast function.

- 5. Left/Right Soft Keys ()
 - a. Make menu selection.
- 6. Up() /Down() Scrolling Keys
 - a. Scroll through records and menu selections.
 - b. Adjust receiver voice volume when in the Talk mode.
 - c. Press to review call log when in the Standby mode.
 - d. Press to enter phonebook when in the Standby mode.
- 7. END; On/Off Key
 - a. Ends a call.
 - b. Leaves current menu operation, up one level.
 - c. Press for 3 seconds to power off the handset.

Base Features

- 1. Reset Button (RESET)
 - a. Restores base station to factory settings
 - b. Reset button is recessed to prevent accidental system reset.
 - c. All handsets (including administrator) and additional base(s) need to be re-registered after a base station reset.
- 2. Page Button (PAGE)

To search for a misplaced handset; press "PAGE" button, all registered handsets will beep for 30 seconds.

Press "PAGE" again or any key on a handset to stop beeping..

- 3. Registration Button (PAGE)
 Enters registration mode along with handset, assigns handset
 - ID (11-19).
- Line Jack Standard RJ-11C/CA-11A connector to plug in the telephone line
- Telephone Jack
 A second RJ-11C to plug in an answering machine or handset.
- 6. DC In: to plug in the power adaptor
